



Grit is described as a person's trait-level tendency to be persistent and pursue his or her long-term goals. It is considered important in college settings because students face many obstacles that can interrupt their progress between the time they first enroll and when they graduate.

Your score on this scale was a **0.00** on a scale of 1 to 5, with higher scores indicating greater levels of Grit.

An **Incremental Mindset** describes a person's view that intelligence is a changeable trait that can be improved. Some research suggests that a person's mindset may impact his or her achievement motivation and that college students with a stronger incremental mindset may persist more in the face of difficulty than students who see academic ability more as something that cannot be improved through effort.

Your score on this scale was a **0.00** on a scale of 1 to 5, with higher scores indicating more of an Incremental Mindset.

Mastery Orientation describes the extent that a student focuses on intrinsic forms of motivation when completing their coursework. Many researchers believe that students are better off when they have a stronger focus on wanting to learn as much as possible and mastering the material covered in their courses. Read more on pages 3-4 and 8 of your textbook.

Your score on this scale was a 0.00 on a scale of 1 to 5, with higher scores indicating more of a Mastery Orientation.

Performance Approach Orientation describes the extent that a student focuses on doing better relative to others when completing their coursework. Striving to outperform your classmates can be an important source of motivation for many, but it has also been associated with the use of some unproductive learning strategies. Read more on pages 8-9 of your textbook.
