besides water, tea is the most abundantly consumed beverage in the world? Although anecdotal reports suggest diverse

health benefits of green tea against obesity, very little research has been conducted to understand its antioxidant and antiinflammatory activities in protecting against nonalcoholic steatohepatitis (NASH), a silent but potentially life-threatening liver disease strongly linked to obesity that may afflict 70 million Americans.

Earlier this year, my colleagues and I were awarded a \$450K USDA grant to expand my seminal work in obese rodents showing that green tea protects against obesity-induced NASH by blocking fat accumulation in the liver and by decreasing inflammatory responses that cause liver injury. The current project, which will support the training of an OSU Nutrition Program doctoral student to learn biochemical and molecular biology techniques, is aimed at understanding how green tea exerts these potent health benefits. Our lab will be examining cellular responses by which green tea protects against NASH

Did you know that, through Nrf2, a cytoprotective protein that enhances antioxidant defenses. Answers are also sought to explain whether green tea reduces inflammation by preventing free radical formation inside the liver or by inhibiting the activation of receptors on liver's surface that activate NFkB, a protein regarded as the master regulator of inflammation.

> This work is anticipated to provide the foundational basis for future clinical trials in humans at high risk for NASH and could also foster novel dietary strategies that lower inflammatory stress, thereby improving the nation's nutrition and health. Also contributing to this work are Josh Bomser (co-PI; EHE, Human Sciences), a molecular nutritionist, and Jose Manautou (co-PI; University of Connecticut), a biochemical toxicologist.

> Richard Bruno, Associate Professor of Human Nutrition, Department of Human Sciences, is a bionutritionist and registered dietitian with expertise in the areas of phytochemical and antioxidant utilization and metabolism in relation to free radicalmediated toxicology.







### CETE PROJECTS SUPPORT OSU DISCOVERY THEMES

CETE is excited to highlight two new evaluation projects aligned with Ohio State's Discovery Themes. The first project, which supports the Energy and Environment theme, is working with the **Great Lakes Fuel Cell Education Partnership**. This partnership is focused on aggregating and evaluating innovative solutions for advancing fuel cell education and training, researching and defining essential technical skills to advance workforce development. The Great Lakes Fuel Cell Education Partnership will serve as a clearinghouse to share proven curriculum materials. As an external evaluator, CETE supports these goals through a three-tiered evaluation framework of outputs, outcomes, and impacts. Visit go.osu.edu/CETE1 for additional information about this project.

In the second project, which supports the Health and Wellness theme, CETE has designed a state-of-the-art evaluation study to gain insight into the impact of an online training program, **InJoy Understanding Birth eClass**. ## OHIO RESOURCE CENTER (ORC) FOCUSES ON ARGUMENTATION AND ONLINE INSTRUCTION

EHE doctoral candidate Deborah Lan from the department of Teaching and Learning (Hui Jin, advisor) is studying argumentation in elementary science. Lan has written an e-publication on teaching argumentation in the K–12 classroom, to be published by ORC this spring. She is also working with ORC's director of STEM initiatives, Terry Shiverdecker, to plan and present the first of a series of ORC TIP (Theory into Practice) seminars. The inaugural seminar (to be held on April 17) will focus on argumentation in the classroom—for all grades and in the four core subjects.

Graduate research associate and EHE doctoral candidate James Kerr from the department of Educational studies (David Stein, advisor) is using his expertise to create an online course to introduce K–12 teachers to the basics of online instruction. The course will be piloted this spring.
